Learning about Fall Harvest is always Fun

Children play together while learning about different fall fruits and vegetables. Teachers set out several different fall fruits and vegetables for the children to explore. They introduced locally grown fruits and vegetables to which it includes different shapes, sizes, colors, and textures. They help the child share and take turns exploring. As the children explore, teachers named each food and talked about it a little. They also asked them questions such as: "Does it grow on a tree or a vine? Who has eaten it before?" They also encourage the children to hold the food and asked them if they are they hard or soft? Are any of them bumpy or rough? Which ones are smooth? Then, children were also asked to sniff the food. For the older toddlers, teachers encouraged the children to sort the fruit.
